- School is very important because it is through it that we set out to discover the world.

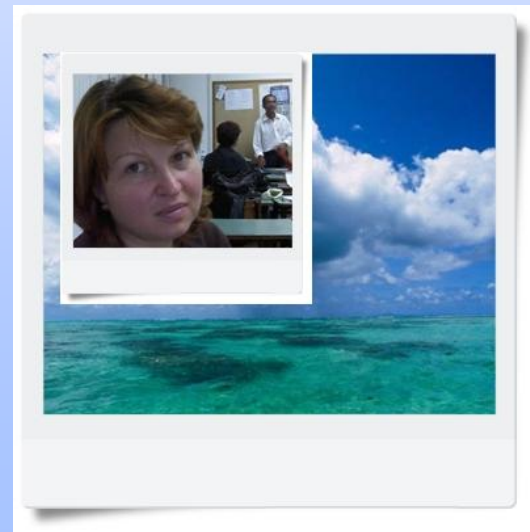


Denys Kizyeyev and Oleksandra Kizyeyev - Ukraine
